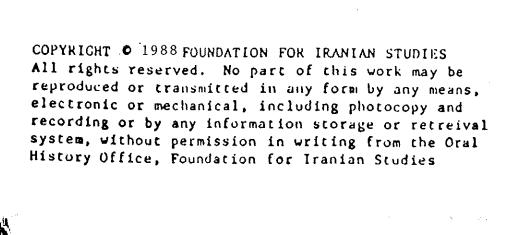

PREFACE

This manuscript is the prduct of a series of tape-recorded interviews conducted for the Oral History of Program of Foundation for Iranian Studies by Sepehr Zabih and Seyyed Vali Reza Nasr with Ahmad Qoreyshi in Moraga, Ca. in April 15, 1983, and in Washington, D.C. in July 8, 1988.

Readers of this Oral History memoir should bear in mind that it is a transcript of the spoken word, and that the interviewer, narrator and editor sought to preserve the informal, conversational style that is inherent in such historical sources. Foundation for Iranian Studies is not responsible for the factual accuracy of the memoir, nor for the views expressed therein.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Ahmad Ghoreichi was born in Meshed in 1933. He completed his elementary education in that city, his high school education in England and his higher education at the University of Colorado and the University of California at Berkeley. After receiving his Ph.D. degree in political science he taught at the University of Colorado for a year prior to returning to Iran to teach at the National University of Iran. He later became Dean of the College of Economics and in 1977-1978 he was appointed Chancellor of the University. On the establishment of the Rastakhiz Party, Dr. Ghoreichi was involved in the formulation of the framework, by-laws, and operational methods of the party structure. He was selected as member of the Executive Committee, member of the Political Bureau and later was chosen as the President of the Executive Committee of the Rastakhiz Party.

Dr. Ghoreichi comes from a prominent family in Khorassan and has close ties with influential figures in the fields of politics and industry. His position as the Chancellor of National University as well as his party activities kept him at the center of the political transformation which was to change the country radically. His recollections reveal facts concerning the events of 1977-1978 seen from the vantage point of the leadership of the Rastakhiz Party

Background of the establishment of the Rastakhiz Party, establishment of a committee under the direction of Manouchehr Ganji to study the causes of alienation and lack of political participation by the people, preparation of a proposal to be rendered to the Shah concerning the necessity of dialogue between the people and their government, the role of the two parties——Iran Novin and Mardom——and the shortcomings of the system, increased participation of the people in a provincial election,

The vast network of Iran Novin and its competition with Mardom during the interim elections, effects of higher spending on the election results, proposal of the committee to put in effect a one party system and the Shah's opposition to the idea, his reference to a statement in Mission for My Country in which he calls a one party system against the Iranian constitution, surprize announcement of dissolution of all parties and establishment of the Rastakhiz Party

Participation of the people in the political process a goal of the Shah in setting up the Rastakhiz, necessity for change in the government on the eve of the establishment of the new party, lack of dialogue among the various groups and sectors of society, public delegation of all responsibility for decision making to the Shah by the Iran Novin leaders, improvement in participation and political activity immediately after the establishment of Rastakhiz

Election procedures during Rastakhiz and non-interference of the government once the candidates were selected, costs of free elections, single-member district versus population relative allocation of representatives, need for revision of the election laws

Inner structure of the Rastakhiz, lack of clear definition of relations between govern ment and the single party, application of ideas taken from single party countries such as Egypt, Algeria and USSR, HIM's views on necessity of close relationship between the party and the government, repeated changes in the party leadership and lack of continuity within the party, HIM's mistake in reappointing Hoveyda and his cabinet after Rastakhiz when the people expected a thorough change 6-8

Replacement of Hoveyda by Amouzegar as Secretary-General of the party, problems of a system when the Prime Minister is also the chief person in the single party, honesty, intelligence and lack of political expertise of Amouzegar, Baheri as Secretary-General and his political style, conflict between Amouzegar as Prime Minister and Baheri as Secretary-General of the party, cooperation of Ansari, Hoveyda and Amouzegar in eliminating Baheri from the scene
