

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Arbi Ovanesiyan was born in Esfahan, Iran to an old Armenian family of the Jolfa neighborhood. He completed his highschool education in Tehran, and after a year of study at Tehran University went to England where he studied cinema. Upon his return to Iran Mr. Ovanesiyan produced a number of modern-artistic films and a number of well-received plays. He was also active in the organization of the Shiraz Art Festival since the Festival's early years. Mr. Ovanesiyan's works have most concerned with the reaction of traditionally-inclined viewers to modern art forms and artistic performances.
