BIOGRAPHICAL NOTE

Mohammad CAli Mojtahedi was born in Gilan. After completing his early education in Iran he received his doctorate in Mathematics in France. He then served as Professor of Mathematics at the Engineering Faculty of Tehran University, and subsequently became Principal of Alborz Highschool in Tehran. Dr. Mojtahedi was also the first Chancellor of Arya Mehr University of Technology, and later the Chancellor of the National University of Iran (Melli University). He has been one contemporary Iran's most renouned and eminent educationalists. His reminiscences trace the evolution of modern education in Iran.
